In recognition of the critical importance to this role of a lived understanding of Indigenous communities, history, values and culture, and in keeping with the BC Human Right Tribunal pursuant to s.42(3) of the Human Right code, Indigenous applicants preferred.

Under the supervision of the AEENP Manager, the **Young Warriors Lead Facilitator** will co- develop and facilitate groups for children, 7-12, and youth, 13-15. Support children and youth to becoming the champions of their own journey.

DUTIES: other duties as required

- Develop curriculum, planning and preparing for group sessions for children (7-12) and youth (13-15)
- Facilitates group programming
- Recruitment of participants
- Carries out intake of participants
- Maintains materials and supplies for the program
- Connecting children and youth to appropriate support systems.
- Collects and maintains statistics, and some financial reporting
- Activity and program reporting
- Work both independently and as part of a team
- Maintains accurate and up to date case notes.
- Represents the VNFC in a respectful manner at all times.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- Awareness of Indigenous culture and issues affecting Indigenous participants.
- Awareness of the challenges faced by children and youth, such as bullying, boundaries, mental health, violence, and stress.
- Knowledge and practicing from a strength-based, trauma informed, culturally sensitive holistic approach.
- Excellent facilitation and communication skills.
- Strong curriculum planning experience
- Counselling skills an asset.
- Has strong personal and professional boundaries.
- Knowledge of the *Child and Family Community Service Act*
- Experience working with children and youth
- Ability to deal with crises and crisis intervention.
- Understanding of Friendship Movement
- Ability to support Indigenous children and youth through personal crisis.
- Computer proficiency in Office 365, Outlook, Basic internet application.
- Must provide a clear vulnerable criminal record check.
